I'm going to discuss briefly what my intention is for this subreddit.

I'm Desmond, and I've been active in both the Men's Rights and the Seduction subreddits. They're both wildly popular subs, but both have major failings that I've slowly identified. They both operate subtly under the feminist imperative. Group-think at both tend to fail to grok the importance of coming to terms with objective reality - something the manosphere has termed "taking the red pill."

I haven't seen serious discussion on sexual strategy that goes beyond the pickup.

We've heard the common trope in many men's subreddits: "Not all women are like that"

That's true. Don't get me wrong. But something it undermines is honest discussion about evolutionary psychology, and society in terms of what a sexual life is like for a man.

"How is that?" I hear you ask. It's simple. Let's describe a problem. Let's say, for example, When I shower my girlfriend with gifts, she breaks up with me or cheats on me.

The men's rights approach: She was a bad egg, find a better one.

The seduction approach: You were displaying unattractive qualities, no shit she left you.

Ok, score one for seddit.

But wait- Let's say I game properly, and maintain an alpha stance, and keep my girlfriend in my frame. We eventually get married and have kids. She later divorces me and takes everything I've got.

The men's rights approach: The law is against you.

The seduction approach: She was a bad egg, find a better one.

Who scores this time? I argue neither. I argue that love is the myth here- more on that later. But it's important to note, in neither scenario was there decent advice to actually move forward in my life. Both ignore the systematic issues that present themselves in relationships, they ignore the reality of psychology, the reality of the law, and the reality of men and women and their subtleties.

Both subreddits appear to still be operating within the frame that feminism put forward. That *the one for you* is just around the corner, and that courting can work, just so long as you find her and know game.

It's false, and disingenuous.

Let's open discussion here. Let's talk about exactly what it means to be a sexual man in the era of feminism. How do we fulfill our needs sexually? Emotionally? How do we do so without taking unnecessary risks?

In a culture where the only thing standing between you and prison is whether the last girl you fucked decides to lie about rape, these are REAL questions that I think are being ignored.

Is marriage or monogamy beneficial in today's market? Or are these feminist imperatives constructed to ensure maximum benefit for women, secretly shaming men for wanting benefits of their own?

One of the reasons I created this community was because I saw that the /r/seduction community was losing heart. Now, I don't mean to be one of those people who posts "Guuuyyyzzzz, we're losing ourselvessss!!!" posts, so I didn't. That's lame.

I spoke with somebody else who had been in the community a long time, he mirrored my fears, but didn't have an active solution.

I created the red pill because I didn't see a good reddit community to discuss the reality behind game.

It's too easy to blame feminism for our troubles.

Men, our happiness is our responsibility. Culture has always shifted, it's dynamic and fluid. It has never and will never stay still.

Feminism was inevitable. Equal rights are something I strongly am in support of. For men and women.

Women have the right to pursue happiness. Nobody should tell them otherwise. **Maximizing** happiness is the goal of every living creature on this planet.



Hey all, and welcome new comers. We've seen our numbers increase steadily, which is good. There is a serious need for red-pill wisdom, and we're here to discuss.

One fear that a lot of people have as we grow in numbers is the risk of losing our signal in the noise. As a subreddit gets more popular, we do risk posts that detract from our original intention.

Some subreddits are rather open about what content they allow.

We will not be that sort of subreddit. I have already removed quite a few posts that serve only to derail conversation. So I think a list of rules is in order.

Posting Submission Rules

- -New submissions must be related to sexual strategy, events that affect sexual strategy, theories about sexual strategy, or stories confirming (or challenging) current theories of sexual strategy.
- -Absolutely **no** direct link screenshots. If you must post a screenshot of a comment, include it as part of your written post. Do not make it your main link.
- -No Memes

Posting Comments Rules

Our discussion is not meant to be just an echo chamber, we absolutely encourage discussion that challenges commonly held beliefs. That is the core of the red pill: challenging what we know.

That being said, if you're new here and haven't read the sidebar, there's a good chance that what you want to say has already been heard and we don't really care to argue it. Some of the opinions and ideas we have here may seem a bit shocking at first if you aren't familiar with our theories. Let me be clear:

Our theories are well thought out, backed by evolutionary psychology, and are regularly confirmed by the behaviors we witness. One of the most astounding parts of the red pill is meeting new people here from other parts of the world... **who all report the same behavior we've witnessed ourselves.** There is REAL truth to the info we're compiling. Attempts to label it misogyny completely misses the point. We do not focus on women as the enemy and consider insults to hurl. Instead, we see women as our goal, and focus on theories as to why they behave the way they do, and how we should behave in light of this information.

If you attempt to "creep" shame, call out misogyny, or otherwise attempt to derail conversation because the information here is shocking to you, it will tell us one thing: You haven't even attempted to understand why and how we've arrived at our conclusions.

Any post that does this will be immediately deleted. A moderator may post a test article for you to read and discuss to prove you are not here to troll. If you fail the test, you may be banned.

We have no interest in becoming an echo chamber, and we don't mind dissenting viewpoints. But if it derails conversation, we will take action. If you're worried you might derail conversation, lurk more.

Hi there, pk here. Been on a bit of a hiatus, only to come back and discover that reddit has been taken over by this new phenomenon and there are dozens of "red pill" subs. Quite an interesting turn of events!

This sub specifically interests me, because it seems to me many debaters here really are missing the point of personal philosophies.

I was just in a small debate about what women like/don't like, and something struck me. The person I was debating was certain that I simply didn't have any proof that my assertions were correct, or that adherence to their conclusions would lead to success, citing my lack of scientific approach or peer reviewed study.

What intrigued me about this was the irony of such a suggestion. In our personal lives, we all use heuristic reasoning and deduction to make personal decisions. All of us do it. Not because we're imperfect creatures or hate science, but because we would be immobilized and crippled by indecision if we didn't.

This is a common approach, to try things and adjust your approach when results aren't as intended.
