Edit: I should have added that I don't necessarily believe that women are attracted to selfish men. To start, I'm pretty skeptical of these papers simply due to personal experience. All of the guys I know who get around with girls are selfish and arrogant, and the most respected and altruistic guy I know has only had one girlfriend (who ended their relationship, I should add). While personal anecdote is not proof, it's an anecdote which is shared by many other guys. I find it hard to believe that we are all wrong.

Edit: I would also add that there's an issue here which is not addressed, and that is whether altruism is truly a rule-in factor. It is possible that altruism is more attractive only if a man has several other qualities - self confidence, popularity, dominant social skills (some might call this swagger or boldness), physical attractiveness, height, and most importantly, resources. A man can be altruistic while having none of these, but a dark triad jerk can have all of them with no altruism. But if these factors are more important, then the jerk will be successful while the unmasculine nice guy is not. Yet if you only take into account altruism in ones stats, it will certainly seem like being more altruistic has an absolute effect on attractiveness. In reality, however, it only makes you more attractive after you have that core set of qualities. The powerful and heroic Batman may be more attractive than the Joker, but the powerful Joker still gets laid - your average nice guy does not.

I do have some thoughts that I've very rarely seen anyone else mention:

There may be something more intrinsic that women find attractive in "assholes" but I've noticed a couple of things that are more mechanic.

Assholes don't have to expend as much effort to socialize and flirt with girls. Caring about only their own experience in the interaction is a whole lot simpler than caring about both.

Another secondary advantage to being an "asshole" is that people then won't want to hang out with you. Which means that it should be easier to learn the little behaviors, styles, etc... that are sexually attractive because that's nearly the only reason that remains for women to want to keep interacting with the asshole.
