

It's not legal. The issue is that it's not legally considered rape. It is still considered sexual assault and therefore illegal.

The wider issue is that sexual assault by females is not taken as seriously as sexual assault by males. This results in less men realising they have been assaulted, reporting their assault, securing a conviction of their assaulter and when the assaulter is convicted they generally receive more lenient convictions than a male would.
