
## my therapist basically told me it's over


After talking about everything I've tried over the last decade to escape this hell he says that I've done everything that I could have which was nice to hear for once, and that I was "understandably battle weary"


He said "I can only help you with 1 of 2 things, either I can help you get back out there and keep trying or I can help you live a life of celibacy, it's up to you"
