Gries is said to have admitted to lying about the rapes and written an apology letter to the man who was the target of her allegations.

**The rape reports led Stanford University police to issue campus-wide electronic alerts, which prompted widespread fear and a protest in October by hundreds of students who marched to demand university officials do more to protect students.**

Investigators also found Gries had filed a sexual harassment complaint in March 2022 against a male coworker with the university's human resources department, which found the allegation was unfounded, prosecutors said.
