

"Porn featuring violence against women is far more popular among women than men. The rate at which women watch violent porn is roughly the same in every part of the world. It isn't correlated with how women are treated."

The interview was made in early 2018 (important to consider because the interviewed made predictions for the next years). Quick summary of topics:

- There are still quite a few guys in the closet, even in the most gay-tolerant areas of the world
- "Weird" porn (elderly people, breastfeeding, other "weird shit") is rare, usually only around 1% of the total searches, but mainstream porn is pretty weird itself (footjobs, anal sex, cartoons...)
- There are more men into overweight women than people think
- "Misogynistic" porn about male-on-female violence and abuse is much more popular among women than men. I'm going to put this one in the title because I assume this will attract the most clicks.
- Women seem particularly concerned about their male partner's sexual orientation. There are waaaaay higher chances that your man is an alcoholic, or a drug addict, or depressed, but still the main concern was if their men were gay.
- Breastfeeding is such a big fetish in India that the searches for how to breastfeed babies are similar in numbers to the searches for how to breastfeed adult men.
- Around 80% of all porn consumption is about other things than "reproductive" acts (man ejaculating inside vagina). Ejaculating anywhere else, using toys and machines, weird fetishes, etc account for 4/5 searches.
- Lesbian porn is much more common among "straight" women than gay porn among straight men. I'm using quotation marks for "straight" women because if you get turned on by other women you're not straight.

Regarding women consuming proportionally more violent porn: this isn't surprising, but let's not be lazy with the analysis. Many sexologists think one reason people are aroused by kink is that it gives them a sense of control over what once was uncontrollable. It's not as simple as self-loathing, "they secretly liked it," or even "they're trying to retraumatize themselves." Does biology have something to do with it? Like, sure, maybe. But it's probably more useful to examine the social structures underlying this instead of throwing up our hands and further devaluing and gaslighting women's sexuality (and important not to forget, too, how much of "biology" is probably just humans reacting to the fact that they're sexually dimorphic and that women reproduce, not direct behavioral genetic differences between the sexes).

Existential anxiety is a powerful driving force of human behavior, and it's aroused by perceived-dangerous/coercive/harassing sexual situations, which most women even in developed cultures have experienced to some degree, often from a very young age. Virtually all major modern societies are patriarchal, so using "how women are treated" as a metric here is flawed; collective trauma and violence against women is fairly ubiquitous — just because a woman hasn't experienced, for example, violent rape doesn't mean she hasn't had extensive sexually-themed experiences with men which her brain interpreted as threatening. People instinctively need to feel safe from harm and secure that they will survive, and the mark left by existentially-threatening situations can't be shamed or wished away — rather, these threats are "remembered" by the brain and the body. The pull of rewriting once-threatening situations with the woman in question now in control, masturbating behind a screen or submitting with a safe word and a trustworthy partner, is powerfully rewarding and can allow a person to form a coherent and safe narrative of their sexuality without stuffing or avoiding. Humans are primarily wired to A. fuck, and B. survive. Female masochism/submission encompasses both in a patriarchal society. It makes perfect sense. (Also keep in mind that in societies where women are "treated better," porn consumption is probably more accessible and socially acceptable for women, which might balance some of these numbers out.)

Regarding far more straight women watching lesbian porn than straight men watching gay porn, this is also not

surprising. Sexual orientation is fluid, largely context-dependent, only weakly-to-moderately genetically determined, and occurs on a spectrum. Some people are *completely* straight or *completely* gay and garner no sexual arousal from watching or engaging in acts discordant with their primary orientation, but most people fall somewhere in the middle, if perhaps far enough to one side not to consider themselves bisexual. Still, modern society is much more tolerant of women having masculine traits than the reverse. Think about how much more ridiculous it would be to name a male child a female name than the reverse (a boy named Jennifer vs a girl named John), or how much less socially acceptable it is for a man to put on his girlfriend's nightgown than a woman to sleep in her boyfriend's shirt. Male femininity is disparaged and discouraged; female masculinity is not to the same degree. So, it could be that while some straight men would enjoy gay porn, a lot of them don't seek it out because of the cognitive dissonance and shame they would feel for jerking off to men doing it. Or, maybe it's true that more women have bisexual tendencies (I'd love to see a study measuring actual sexual arousal in women vs men watching same-sex porn), but you still can't rule out environmental influences for this.
