At the same time, I'd never advise someone else with a history of addiction that it's OK to "go off the wagon." I've seen people who went on one bender who ended up in the hospital! It is pretty common for addicts to cycle endlessly between addiction and recovery. (Lots of heartache for their loved ones.) So it is probably safer to simply abstain; thus I have no argument with people who say it's the only way! Better safe than sorry?!

As far as "temporary" ... I haven't been to a meeting in decades, but I still use the steps all the time, mostly in terms of self-reflection, being willing to have my character defects removed, etc. I don't think this is a process that miraculously ends at some point and we're "finished" (other than by dying, lol).
