There is power in your words. SPEAK what you've learned out loud in the right moments.

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Consider just Proverbs 15

- 1 A soft answer turneth away wrath: but grievous words stir up anger.
- 2 The *tongue of the wise* useth knowledge aright: but the *mouth of fools* poureth out foolishness.
- 3 The eyes of the Lord are in every place, beholding the evil and the good.
- 4 A wholesome tongue is a tree of life: but perverseness therein is a breach in the spirit.
- 5 A fool despiseth his father's *instruction*: but he that regardeth reproof is prudent.
- 6 In the house of the righteous is much treasure: but in the revenues of the wicked is trouble.
- 7 The *lips of the wise* disperse knowledge: but the heart of the foolish doeth not so.
- 8 The sacrifice of the wicked is an abomination to the Lord: but the *prayer* of the upright is his delight.
- 9 The way of the wicked is an abomination unto the Lord: but he loveth him that followeth after righteousness.
- 10 *Correction* is grievous unto him that forsaketh the way: and he that hateth reproof shall die.
- 11 Hell and destruction are before the Lord: how much more then the hearts of the children of men?
- 12 A *scorner* loveth not one that *reproveth* him: neither will he go unto the wise.
- 13 A merry heart maketh a cheerful countenance: but by sorrow of the heart the spirit is broken.
- 14 The heart of him that hath understanding seeketh knowledge: but the *mouth* of fools feedeth on foolishness.
- 15 All the days of the afflicted are evil: but he that is of a merry heart hath a continual feast.
- 16 Better is little with the fear of the Lord than great treasure and trouble therewith.
- 17 Better is a dinner of herbs where love is, than a stalled ox and hatred therewith.
- 18 A wrathful man *stirreth* up strife: but he that is slow to anger appeaseth *strife*.
- 19 The way of the slothful man is as an hedge of thorns: but the way of the righteous is made plain.
- 20 A wise son maketh a glad father: but a foolish man despiseth his mother.
- 21 Folly is joy to him that is destitute of wisdom: but a man of understanding walketh uprightly.
- 22 Without counsel purposes are disappointed: but in the multitude of counsellors they are established.
- 23 A man hath joy by the answer of his mouth: and a word spoken in due season, how good is it!
- 24 The way of life is above to the wise, that he may depart from hell beneath.
- 25 The Lord will destroy the house of the proud: but he will establish the border of the widow.
- 26 The thoughts of the wicked are an abomination to the Lord: but the words of the pure are pleasant words.
- 27 He that is greedy of gain troubleth his own house; but he that hateth gifts shall live.
- 28 The heart of the righteous studieth to answer: but the *mouth of the wicked* poureth out evil things.
- 29 The Lord is far from the wicked: but he *heareth* the prayer of the righteous.
- 30 The light of the eyes rejoiceth the heart: and a good report maketh the bones fat.
- 31 The ear that *heareth* the reproof of life abideth among the wise.
- 32 He that refuseth instruction despiseth his own soul: but he that *heareth* reproof getteth understanding.
- 33 The fear of the Lord is the instruction of wisdom; and before honour is humility.

See how much this talks about the mouth, hearing, speaking. Often times christians will not speak what they know out loud as if just reading or hearing it is enough. When I do a teaching, I am truly more blessed than the ones I teach because I have SPOKEN the words. Same goes for prayer, I was raised Methodist, which meant

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everyone prayed a lot and praised the Lord a lot, just never out loud. Most all of those people love the Lord and are still in that church some 25 years later, but their lives look the same. They haven't gone deeper in their faith at all as if their starting point was their station in life. The same applies to my life. Satan is a liar and tries to constantly slip lies in our head. Lies about who God is, about His character, ability, power, mercy, grace, etc, etc. Also lies about us, the church, our role, our salvation, our inheritance, our ability, what is and isn't possible, etc, etc, etc. What I've personally done that increases my faith, edifies me, encourages me, and makes me more useful to the Kingdom is to often time, in any circumstance, I will speak the truth that is opposite to the lies when they are popping in my head or heard among other christians, said in love, and I have almost completely eliminated the "silent prayer" from my life.
