Last year Uber recieved 235 reports of rape. This was found just to be 235 times the woman thought she deserved a better driver/car/etc. No actual rape involved.

280 reports of attempted rape. This was found to be 275 times the woman thought she deserved a better driver/car/etc. It was found to be 5 times that the driver made a cat-call or comment to them about how they look. No actual rape involved.
