There were about 8,500 verified hate crimes in the 2018 year. There were over 16,000 police agencies that submitted crime data. Less than 17% of them were homophobic in nature. There were more religious based hate crimes that year in the US, at an 18.7% rate. Basically less than .00001% of the US population even gives a shit based on this data. Were the US homophobic we'd see way higher numbers and systemic discrimination, which we don't in slightest.

EDIT: The only gays experiencing discrimination would be gay men, since no shelters exist for abused men and abuse help groups often turn men away.
