

Threw away my IVF meds this morning

I'm almost 41. I had two "natural" pregnancies that both ended in miscarriage around 8-9 weeks. We did the fertility go round and I found I had a blocked tube, small uterine septum. We ended up trying IVF. Round 1 yielded only 2 eggs retrieved and no viable embryos. Round 2 yielded 3 eggs and no PGS normal embryos. Then the pandemic happened and because we were told to just use donor eggs anyway, we put everything else on hold.

I spent most of the last year inside going nowhere because I'm high risk for COVID due to other underlying conditions. My marriage is going strong but we've decided that we really don't want to use donor eggs and with everything that happened over the last year we're not ready to adopt or do anything further. Maybe we'll adopt, maybe we'll just get more

I spent the weekend seriously thinking about what I really wanted next. Did I want to try another IVF round right now knowing it probably won't work again? When I was honest with myself the thought of it repulsed me.

My husband and I have only been married since 2019 and we've been through a lot of stress in a short time, but we've also settled into a pretty nice life in spite of everything and I actually like that life. I like it being us and our two cats. I like sleeping in on a Saturday morning.

It's really not a good time for us to consider adoption. So this morning, I threw away the leftover fertility meds in the fridge from last year - I don't need that reminder looking at me and I really don't want to have to turn my abdomen into a pin cushion ever again.

While a part of me is sad it won't happen for me, especially as it seems everyone I know is pregnant right now, not having IVF hanging over me again is a relief. I'm glad we tried when we did and that I can at least walk away knowing I did what I could. This is more about my wanting to not be a slave to my ovulation cycle or AMH numbers than anything else. I feel like the whole IVF/fertility cycle is a prison and I can finally be outdoors in the sunshine.
