Which leads me to my question, which is: didn't Muhammad almost exclusively marry divorcés and widows (with the exception of Aisha and maybe Mariam)? This may be to his credit, as it would imply a dispassion towards dunya, but it seems that he did not place a great deal of emphasis on virginity.

From lurking this sub, I can see that in general you guys do value virginity, and I believe that you have good reasons for doing so. But how do you square that with your obligation to emulate your prophet as closely as possible?

"generally speaking, the Prophet (peace and blessings of Allaah be upon him) encouraged marriage to virgins.

There is the story of Jaabir (may Allaah be pleased with him), whose father had died, leaving him with sisters. In his case it would not have been suitable for him to marry a virgin who was young like them. So he wanted to marry a woman who had been previously married, who could take care of them and look after them, and the Prophet (peace and blessings of Allaah be upon him) approved of his decision.

It was narrated that Jaabir ibn 'Abd-Allaah (may Allaah be pleased with them both) said: "The Prophet (peace and blessings of Allaah be upon him) asked me, 'Have you got married?' I said, 'Yes.' He said, 'A virgin or a previously-married woman?' I said, 'A previously-married woman.' He said, 'Why not a young girl, whom you could play with and she could play with you?' I said, 'I have sisters and I wanted to marry a woman who could gather them together and comb their hair and take care of them.' He said: 'You will reach, so when you have arrived (at home), I advise you to associate with your wife (that you may have an intelligent son).'"

(Narrated by al-Bukhaari, 1991; Muslim, 715)

According to another report narrated by al-Bukhaari (2257), "... so she could teach them and discipline them."

Shaykh Mustafa al-Ruhaybaani said:

"It is Sunnah for the one who wants to get married to marry a virgin, because the Prophet (peace and blessings of Allaah be upon him) said to Jaabir, 'Why not a virgin whom you could play with and she could play with you?' (agreed upon) – unless there is a reason for which marrying a previously-married woman is better, in which case he should choose such a woman over a virgin, in order to serve that interest." (Mataalib Uli al-Nuha, 5/9, 10) "

They said, "Why, O Messenger of Allah?" He said, "Because of their ingratitude (kufr)." It was said, "Are they ungrateful to Allah?" He said, "They are ungrateful to their companions (husbands) and ungrateful for good treatment. If you are kind to one of them for a lifetime then she sees one (undesirable) thing in you, she will say, 'I have never had anything good from you." (Narrated by al-Bukhari, 1052)

A hadeeth has been reported to this effect in Sunan At-Tirmithi. Abu Umaamah may Allaah be pleased with him narrated that the Prophet, sallallaahu 'alayhi wa sallam, said, "There are three whose prayers would not be raised beyond their ears: the runaway slave until he returns, a woman who spends the night while her husband is angry with her, and a people's imaam (in prayer) whom they dislike." [At-Tirmithi]

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and people say that this is from rejecting sex no:

"The reason for incurring such punishment is not confined to the wife denying her husband his right to sexual enjoyment; rather, it extends to include denying him any of his rights over her. Al-Munaawi may Allaah have mercy upon him wrote, "The hadeeth refers to the case in which a wife spends her night while her husband is angry with her because of a Sharee'ah-valid reason such as her ill manners, impoliteness, or disobedience and rebellion..." [Faydh Al-Qadeer]"

and this from another site: "they will not ascend to heaven"

If the husband is angry with her because she is refusing to share his bed, then her sin is even worse, because of the report narrated by Ibn Khuzaymah in his Saheeh from 'Ata' ibn Dinar al-Hudhali, according to which the Messenger of Allaah (peace and blessings of Allaah be upon him) said: "There are three whose prayers will not be accepted and they will not ascend to heaven or even go beyond their heads: ... a woman whose husband calls her at night and she refuses." This hadeeth was classed as saheeh by al-Albaani in Saheeh al-Targheeb wa'l-Tarheeb, 485.

## and this:

It was narrated from Mu'aadh ibn Jabal that the Prophet (peace and blessings of Allaah be upon him) said: "No woman offends her husband in this world but his wife among the hoor al-iyn says, 'Do not offend him, may Allaah kill you, for he is only with you for a short time and soon he will leave you and come to us." Narrated by al-Tirmidhi (1174) and classed as saheeh by al-Albaani in Saheeh al-Tirmidhi.

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
