I've blocked her on every social media platform and ask my friends not to give her details about my personal life - I don't care about her, so I tune out when I hear she's been acting violent towards other men.

Her abuse did not start with me or stop after I ended our relationship. Cops would fawn over her after she threw bottles at random cars in the middle of one of her psychotic episodes.

I had a judge tell me that I shouldn't be scared of a pretty little woman like her when I requested a no contact order. Then my abusing ex put a bullet through the windshield of my car after I stopped returning any calls/texts not related to getting my shit back from her apartment.

Everything was reduced to "criminal mischief", despite a camera catching her in the act. I got a no contact and restraining order on her that I have to renew every two years. She is allowed to contest this in court, in person, with no additional security given to me.

While women do use physical violence, most of the abuse they enact is social and psychological. Often the conversation around male victims of domestic abuse is framed in gynocentric terms and the issue is presented in such a way that women most often experience it. Even after all the effort we've made to get this concession, it's still fucked up and gynocentric to view the issue in this way.

So we're stuck in a situation where we have two sides, one vehemently denying this problem and downplaying it, and one framing the problem through womens experience of it and saying "sometimes men too!".

If we want to discuss abuse against men, we should also be discussing the myriad of ways women utilize society and the power they hold in it to bully, abuse, and gaslight men into doing things for them or terrorize them into saying/not saying things, and so on. But talking about that subject might make women too uncomfortable, because they might cotton on to the fact that if you deign to equate the two, women essentially go around regularly beating men in public and abuse of men is normalized and even encouraged.

Actually representing mens experiences with abuse would reveal the types of abuse women tend to use and how typical they are, because it's not just domestic, it's fairly normal.
